After opening to great fanfare in Miami and London, Ian Schrager and Marriott International's new global brand of luxury hotels, EDITION, has made its way to New York, claiming the landmark Met Life Tower on Madison Square Park. The **NEW YORK EDITION** has 273 rooms and suites with jaw-dropping 360-degree views, and a restaurant by London chef Jason Atherton with three intimate dining rooms overlooking the park. Inspired by the gilded glamour of prewar Manhattan, the hotel has sumptuous wooden paneling and period decor, with cheeky, modernist accents that have become synonymous with Schrager properties around the world.
